Guidelines for CE articles

- 2500-3000 words
- minimum of two references
- cannot have been published in any other trade publication
- authors must have recognized expertise in subject matter
- chosen up to nine months before published

Photo guidelines

- minimum of 300 dpi at size to be published
- digital photos only

On occasion, a Case Study will be included in the issue. The Case Study depicts an unusual/extraordinary case that a veterinary technician was involved with.

Case Study guidelines

- 600-750 words depending on number of photos
- photos must be used to illustrate points
- technical information on symptoms, laboratory tests, surgery, and outcomes must be included with the article
